

Something truly beautiful is happening in our community — people are coming together across churches, organizations, schools, and generations to care for one another in real, practical ways. It's a reminder that while individuals can do wonderful things on their own, when we share in the work, the gift is multiplied.

Our community meals are a perfect example. More than just food, these meals offer comfort, connection, and dignity to anyone who comes. We've been blessed to have Tri Kappa host last month's meal, following in the footsteps of a local business, Sweet Lou's, that sponsored one last year. Now, the Lions Club has stepped forward to do the same. Each group brings unique gifts, but together they are part of something bigger — neighbors loving neighbors.

Our Community Garden is growing, too — literally and spiritually. We're also incredibly thankful to the American Legion, who has graciously, over the last several years, allowed us the use of a portion of their building for our Food Pantry. This space has become a vital hub where families can receive much-needed groceries with kindness and care.




