I've been blessed in many ways: I have a loving and supportive family, I have a church family that is always there for me, I have a place to live, and I have a God who has been with me through all of the good and all of the bad. But what I'm feeling so grateful for right now is that I am now the 1st grade teacher at Westville Elementary School.

The journey to this moment has taken me through a lot of twists and turns, but I have learned so much and changed in amazing ways. Every time I felt discouraged or like maybe I made a wrong choice, God showed me that I was on the right path. Just this summer has shown me how important it is to wait for God's timing.

Every application that I filled out felt like another opportunity for hope. Every response or interview gave me more experience and helped me prepare for the next. The problem was that it was getting close to the end of summer, and I had yet to get a job. I did have a plan to substitute until I was able to get a teaching position, but it would be disappointing not to have my own classroom.

If I had been offered any of those other jobs, I would have jumped at them. I would have missed out on the opportunity to work less than 5 minutes from my home at a school that I attended from kindergarten through graduation. I wouldn't have been able to be an even bigger part of this community that I care about so much.

Five years ago, I was an out of work housewife. I quit my job as a receptionist a few months before and was hoping to find a way to work from home. My husband and I were trying to start a family and had begun fertility treatments. I was feeling hopeful for my future, even though I still didn't know how exactly I would be earning a living.

Five years later, I am now divorced with no children. I'm living at my grandparents' house until I can afford a place of my own, and I'm driving a car that I'm afraid may break down at any moment. Yet, I feel more blessed now than I ever have before. I know that I'm where I'm supposed to be. God definitely knows what he's doing, even when we don't realize it.


