

From the Pastor – October 2025

Dear Beloved Church Family,

As we step into the month of October, the air begins to cool, the leaves begin to turn, and we are reminded once again of the beauty of God's creation and the changing seasons of life. Yet even as nature settles into a rhythm of rest and reflection, our world continues to stir with unrest, uncertainty, and sorrow.

In recent weeks, we have witnessed heartbreaking events both at home and abroad. The devastating earthquakes in Afghanistan have claimed thousands of lives and left communities in mourning. In Gaza, the humanitarian crisis has deepened, drawing global concern and grief. Here in the United States, violence has erupted in places meant to be safe—schools, places of worship, and even government buildings. The recent attack on an ICE facility in Dallas and the ongoing rise in hate-fueled rhetoric remind us that fear and division are still very much present in our society.

Test everything against the teachings of Christ. Ask: does this bring peace or division? Does it reflect love or fear? Does it glorify God or elevate human pride?

The Apostle Paul reminds us in Colossians 3:2, "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things." Our allegiance is not to any political party, ideology, or movement—it is to the Kingdom of God. Our devotion belongs not to personalities or platforms, but to the One who gave His life for us.

Now more than ever, the world needs the Church to be a beacon of light.

Let us be people of peace in a time of conflict. Let us be people of truth in a time of confusion. Let us be people of love in a time of hate. And let us never forget that our hope is not in the systems of this world, but in the unshakable promises of our Savior.

As we move through this season of harvest and thanksgiving, may we also sow seeds of kindness, compassion, and courage. Let us pray for those who suffer, speak up for those who are silenced, and serve those who are in need.
