

Worship: Pastor Toby is working on a series for the Advent season, "God With Us" We are still looking for a worship leader for music and etc. Kay is also looking for the music CD's for the cantata.

Outreach – Kathie Long is applying for a grant that is being offered through the conference. The funds would be used for helping families in need. We are looking at offering groceries monthly to families. Care & Share is up to 38 bags a week

Resale Shop: Open house Dec. 2nd 4-6:30pm

The Food pantry and the Benevolence fund received \$5000. Each from the resale shop.

New Business: Our church will support the community Christmas baskets with 70 jars of spaghetti sauce and 70 packages of noodles that need to be delivered to the church by Dec. 7th. We will also supply hats and mittens for the Christmas baskets.
