



From the Pastor's Desk: A New Year, A New Opportunity in Christ

Dear Church Family,

As we step into **2026**, we are reminded that every new year is a fresh gift from God—a chance to grow deeper in His grace and experience His fullness in our lives. The Apostle Paul writes in **Philippians 3:13-14 (NIV)**:

***We faithfully dispersed weekly backpacks to 30 to 41 school kids. Our packing team, delivery team, and our shopper, Kay Tetzloff, make this ministry happen. The backpack ministry is self-sustaining through congregation and community donations. St. Vincent DePaul from the local Catholic Churches has also been very generous.

***The Resale Shop had a successful year and generously donated \$5000 to the Nest Shelter, \$5000 to the Food Pantry, and \$5000 to the Benevolence Fund. 80 pillows were also donated at Christmas to the Nest from our congregation.

***Monthly Community Meals continued to grow, with regular faces and new ones sharing delicious meals together.

***Bible School and the Maze of Terror delighted kids!

***The Community Garden and Free Farmer's Market were successful beyond our expectations. Frank, Sherri, and others proved they truly have green thumbs.

***The Benevolence Fund was used by those in need throughout the year. Our compassion and generosity helped several folks who found themselves struggling to pay rent/water bills/NIPSCO bills. \$1830 of assistance was given, plus many gas cards.

***The Blessing Box and Thursday After School Snacks help to feed those who may be hungry or need a quick snack or meal.

***We celebrated Pastor Toby on Pastor Appreciation Sunday, reminding us of the many blessings of his ministry to us.

God has truly had His hands in our ministries. We praise Him for blessing our ministries so abundantly, and we pray that He continue to challenge and guide us in 2026.





We upgrade hugely our sound system and added 3 TV's


If you have a special need for prayer, the prayer chain can be activated by calling church Secretary Jane Bachman (785-2314)





